



ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATIONS IN MARINA CABO ROIG

1.- WASTE MANAGEMENT

Waste types

Any activity can produce urban or dangerous waste. Professionals doing any works at MARINA CABO ROIG should know that within our installations there is the necessary infrastructure for waste collection, storage and management, in accordance with current regulations. Likewise, they are requested to comply with the following environmental guidelines.

All professionals working at MARINA CABO ROIG should distinguish between:

a) Urban waste

- Paper and cardboard
- Rubbish
- Glass
- Scrap metal

b) Dangerous waste

- Contaminating empty plastic bottles (oil, grease, paints, solvents...)
- Contaminating empty metallic cans (paints, grease...)
- Used oil
- Used batteries and cells
- Empty spray cans
- Materials contaminated with hydrocarbons (papers, cloths...)
- Fuel/Oil used filters

What do I do with the waste?

MARINA CABO ROIG has urban and dangerous waste collection points at your disposal. All necessary security measures have been implemented to prevent any damage to the environment. Urban waste is collected by the refuse collection city service or by any other authorised company. Dangerous waste is collected by management companies authorised by Valencia's Environment Ministry. Waste containers are properly labelled, in order to be only used for the indicated waste.



General rules of conduct

Different waste types should not get mixed up, and very specially urban and dangerous waste should never get mixed up. Space in containers should be optimized in as far as possible, placing all waste in an orderly fashion.

Please use protection (gloves) when you handle dangerous waste.

- Containers must be kept closed and in an upright and stable position.
- If you notice any leaks or damage on the containers please tell the staff.
- In case containers are full or almost full, please let the staff know so that they can replace them.
- If you produce any waste, which is of a different type and cannot be placed in the available containers, please get in touch with the staff and they will inform you about appropriate procedures for that type of waste.
- If you need to empty fuel or oil tanks because they had a water leak, do not dump the content in the drains or the sea. Please put the content into a can, leave it at the dangerous waste collection point and inform the staff.
- If you remove your boat's used battery, please storage it properly at the dangerous waste collection point.
- In case a contaminating fluid or oil is spilled over the ground, please mop the spillage up immediately by using absorbent materials.

2.- BOATS MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES

- Washing
- Painting/Antifouling
- Sanding
- Engine service

Boats hull cleaning

- It is strictly forbidden to spill water used for the washing down to the sea.
- Boats hull can only be washed at the hull maintenance area.
- Water use optimization: Water consumption must be reduced as to the minimum necessary amount to guarantee effective washing.
- Please use pressure washers.
- Do dry cleanings if possible.
- Whenever possible, scrape the hull surface and the propellers before pressure washing.

Boats painting or varnishing

- If the boat is to be spray painted, please consider wind direction and intensity, so that the paint jet doesn't affect neighbouring boats.



- Empty cans of paints, thinners, varnish, etc. must be placed into their specific containers located at the dangerous waste collection point. All cans must be completely emptied.

- If you are using spray paints, there are specific containers to collect empty spray cans.

- Use anti-fouling with low biocide capacity.

- If you clean paintbrushes or planes with solvents (acetone), try to recover and reuse dirty solvents. Dumping any solvent in the drains or the sea is strictly forbidden. Please ask the marina staff.

Hull sanding

- Pay attention to the wind direction and intensity, so that no waste, shavings or dust can damage neighbouring boats.

- Please sweep or vacuum all shavings or dust that came off the hull, and then leave them on the rubbish container.

- Prevent shavings and dust from dropping down to the sea.

- Use masks and security glasses while working.

Engines repair

- Put used oil into an appropriate recipient so that after finishing the work you can place this oil in the specific deposit available for customers.

- In case of spillage please wipe off using absorbent cloths or products. Then throw them into the contaminated materials containers located at the dangerous waste collection point.

- Used oil and fuel filters must be placed in their specific containers located at the dangerous waste collection point, and never at the used oil container. Please drain the oil or diesel from the filters as much as possible before placing them in the container.

- Put a bucket or a container under the boat's crankcase, so that any potential oil dripping or leaks can be collected without using absorbent products. Then place the collected oil in the appropriate container.

- Use funnels to empty used oil into the appropriate container located at the collection point.

- Dumping used oil in the sewer system or the sea is strictly forbidden.

- After replacing the oil, please leave the cans in their specific containers at the dangerous waste collection point.

- In the event of an accidental spill within the harbour installations, please inform immediately the marina staff.
